

Surgical Complication Symptoms

Fever over 39° C (102° F) or chills
Increase in pain not managed with pain medication
Ongoing vomiting and nausea (more than 2 days)
Blood in vomit or stools
Extreme diarrhea or constipation (more than 3 days)
Redness or pain in legs or arms

Pain with deep breathing
Bleeding, pus, warmth at your incisions
Unable to eat and/or drink
Very low blood sugar, fainting and passing out.
Incision that is open, red, swollen painful or infected
Abdominal pain (bloating or swollen stomach)

If you experience any of these symptoms, go to the PLC Emergency Department, and notify them that you have had bariatric surgery.
